


HANK BULL LANDscape: Storm Bay Paintings 2024

Isabella Casey DEATH AND THE KILLER WHALE

The Skookumchuck Myth

In Sechelt Legend, there is a burial ground beneath the skookumchuck rapids in Egmont, BC. In the original myth of the killer whale, the spirit of a great warrior, just killed in battle, is asked by a killer whale if the man would like to join him hunting. The warrior replies in the affirmative, and his spirit disappears. Suddenly, two killer whales are seen leaving the shore.

Here is my modern version.

"I have been waiting for this day for a very long time."

My grandfather's ghost sat comfortably at the foot of my bed.

"How long, grandpa?"

He pursed his lips. "65 years...so it did feel long. Of course, you grew much too fast for my liking." He placed a hand on my shin, hidden under my blanket. When he moved, the air around him seemed to quiver, almost like a heat wave, but faster.

"I was already an old man when you were born," he said. 'But if there is anything I'd like to stick around for, it's you."

"Are you going to stick around?" I asked him. It might be cool to have a ghost haunting the house. Especially one that I knew. We could scare my friends together. "You'll see me tomorrow at the funeral," he said, shaking his head. "But I can't be sure when I will next see you after that."

"Maybe when I die," I said.

My grandpa shook his head again. "It'll be before then," he said.

"Well, that's good. I'm only fifteen."

"Yes, you're already fifteen."

I could see that his figure was starting to shimmer, the edges of his body starting to blend into his surroundings.

"Grandpa, why have you been waiting 65 years for this day?"

His edges thickened, as if I had taken a sharpie and traced over a pencil sketch. He smiled at me, and his dark eyes seemed very far away, like he was receding in on himself. It was like the detached start I get when I see my lone figure reflected in the TV screen. Somewhere, a story is happening, and I am a faded image in the background. My grandpa's edges thickened, and then he disappeared.

I dreamt I was my grandfather. It was the kind of dream where you know. You know the setting, even if you've never been there in real life. You know your name, and how old you are. Leonard Harry George King, 19 years old. You know the general plot of the dream as soon as you land in it. You know the other characters, even if you don't actually know them. I was racing my best friend, my favourite friend in the world, Tyrell Cody Dixon, in our stupid little skiffs that we were way too proud to own. And as soon as I knew the first scene, I guessed the last. Maybe your intuition is strongest in you're asleep. Mine is, anyways.



I watched, frozen (you know how dreams really slow your body down), as Tyrell and I moved too recklessly. We were 19. I watched, helpless, as Tyrell capsized into the skookumchuck, the s-tl'-kwu. He was 19.

After I watched, I looked. That was the longest part of the dream. I looked and looked and looked. I circled the rapids. I even went through them. By the time I was finally turning around to rush home and call the police, he was already gone. Out of the corner of my eye, I saw killer whales playing.

We gave my grandfather a rather odd burial. My mother explained that legend has it there is an ancient burial ground beneath the s-tl'i-kwu. Sihl'-layk, it's called. And I thought, yeah, that makes sense. We grabbed gentle handfuls of his ashes and let them fly on the wind into the rapids and whirlpools below. I thought, yeah, this makes sense. I swear I almost glimpsed the island below, with green grass and headstones and bouquets of long since dried flowers.

Then, I saw my grandpa. His spirit sat on the edge of the cliff, beyond the chain link fences, where nobody is supposed to go. He turned to look at my mom and me and my grandmother, and he smiled. One last time.

"Look!" My mom said.

A killer whale was swimming towards my grandpa. He inclined his head, and I knew, like how I knew in my dream last night, that the two were exchanging words. "Would you like to come hunt seals with me?" I imagined the killer whale asked my grandfather.

"Yes," I imagined my grandfather replied, "I have been waiting 65 years to come hunting with you."

What we saw from our point behind the fence was this, my grandfather's edges thickened, and then he disappeared. Beneath the cliff side, two killer whales dove into the rapids and swam away together.































































HANK BULL BIO
